

EQUALITY

is equal treatment and availability of health care services for all people.

conditions in the environments in which people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks.


Population living in severe housing problems, 2020

- lack of kitchen facilities & plumbing facilities
- more than 1.5 persons per room
 - severe cost burden (monthly housing costs including utilities exceed 50% of monthly income)







There are 9 obstetricians in Manatee County


Access to obstetric-gynecologic care in rural communities is declining, resulting in:

- · increased numbers of out-of-hospital births
- · births in hospitals without an obstetric unit
- preterm births
- higher rates of delayed prenatal care, pregnancyrelated hospitalizations
- · low birth weight infants, and infant mortality

Top 2 Leading Causes of Death, 2020




EQUITY CONSIDERATIONS
